SLIME GUIDE

Ingredients & Tools

- ❖ All-Purpose PVA White Glue (We like Elmer's)
- ❖ Foaming Hand Soap (We like Method Sweet Water)
- ❖ Laundry Detergent (We like Tide Free & Gentle)
- ❖ Measuring Cups - 1 cup and ½ cup
- ❖ Measuring Spoons - 1 tablespoon
- ❖ Large Spoon or Spatula
- ❖ Large Bowl or Container
- ❖ Disposable Gloves
- ❖ Slime Food Coloring (Optional)
- ❖ Slime Scents (Optional)
- ❖ Charms, Sprinkles, Glitter, Fish Beads (Optional)



Step 1:

Measure out 1 cup of All-Purpose White Glue. I like to use Elmer's Glue in our slime recipes. Pour the glue into a large bowl.



Add to the glue $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of foaming hand soap. Make sure to pump the soap straight from the bottle so it's foamy and bubbly. This helps the slime become soft and fluffy.



Mix the glue and foaming hand soap together until it's thoroughly combined.




Step 2:

Now we get to add in colors and scents to our slime! If you don't want to add any in, then just skip this step!

Add in a few drops of the color you want your slime to be.

Add in a few drops of the scent you want your slime to smell like. You don't have to add this in if you don't want to or don't have scent.

Mix together until all the glue is the color you chose. Add more drops of color now if you want it darker.



Step 3:

Now we get to add in charms, fish beads, sprinkles and glitter to our slime! If you don't want to add any in, then just skip this step!

Add in the charms of your choice. You can add in as many as you want. It's best to add it in now because it's easier to mix them in the bowl and get it into all of the slime.

Mix together until all the charms are mixed into the slime. Add more charms now if you want more inside your slime.



Step 4:

Activator time! I like to use Tide Free and Gentle liquid detergent as the activator in our slime recipes.

I always start with 2 tablespoons of activator and then add more, 1 tablespoon at a time as I need it.

Add 2 tablespoons of activator to your slime and mix really well. Your slime will get wet and stringy as you mix.

Now add in 1 tablespoon more of activator and mix really well. The slime will start to come together in a ball.



Step 5:

Time to work our slime! Dip your fingers into the activator and rub your hands together gently so the activator is covering your hands.

Gently lift the slime out of the bowl and mix, knead, stretch and play gently with your slime to get all of the activator in there.

It will take a few minutes, but as you pull and knead, the slime will come together and become stretchy fun.

I like to let my slime sit for 5 minutes once it's ready to get super stretchy.
