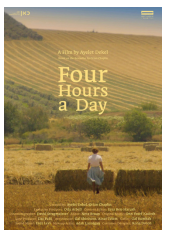


24 Days

Exodus 91

This film tracks Israeli diplomat Asher Naim's mission to rescue 15,000 Ethiopian Jews during Operation Solomon in 1991. As he learns about these African Jews and navigates the complexities of bureaucracy and politics, his faith in himself and his country is tested.

Night at the Garden

In 1939, 20,000 Americans rallied in New York's Madison Square Garden to celebrate the rise of Nazism -- an event largely forgotten from U.S. history. Made entirely from archival footage filmed that night, it shines a light on the power of demagoguery and anti-Semitism in the US.

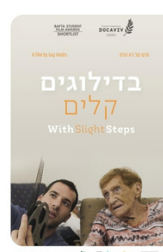


Wet Dog
