Our production of Brick by Brick was a smashing hit!

With memories from the past, familiar faces, an emotional storyline, awesome music, and an amazingly talented cast, this production was a true celebration of 40 years. The Center has been part of this community's many milestones and, with Hashem's help, will be part of many more for years to come.

Brick by Brick featured nine original songs and a fresh and affecting storyline. The play told the story of a new family who has just moved to our community. Transplanted from L.A., where the husband/father has been doing business for 10 years, this family—though Syrian—feels very out of place. Having not grown up in the community, the kids don't know any SY lingo and struggle to fit into Sephardic culture. Through flashbacks, cast members begin to tell this family about the Center. By learning about how the Center first began and how much it enriched the lives of program participants, this family comes to see how the Center might be the saving grace in their effort to belong. They can lean on the Center as the unifying force that will strengthen their connection to their Sephardic roots and help them build a true and lasting home among the Syrian Jews of Brooklyn. This way, an intriguing parallel is revealed as the play unfolds; just as the Center is built brick by brick through the lens of the past, the sense of hope and possibility this family feels is becoming renewed in the present –and all because of the institution that's always given us a place to call our own –the Sephardic Community Center.

As a single woman, there is little night life; this brought me out to socialize, create, bond, and to be a part of something special. It was an opportunity to leave everyday business and social pressures and connect with peers and community members to cement the legacy of the preeminent community organization.

I feel blessed. I feel spoiled. Why did The Center make this huge investment in 60 cast members? It could have been easy to honor Morris Bailey and the founders at a fancy dinner on the ocean, or at the Pierre. But no. This is the epitome of legendary – to honor the founders with the Community spirit that was created by all the community leaders. It was so appropriate. This is a largess and “sufeh” that extends into “us,” the community members.

Every step of this process was extremely heartwarming. Starting with Rachel Novick, I was asked to participate in the production. I told her that I am not Syrian, I can't sing or dance. “She said that's fine, and I am Moroccan.” So I joined.

I did not know that this would be the greatest experience of my life. I did not know how many kind cast members I would be working with. The producers, choreographers, band, writers, technicians, and make-up artists were all over the top. We were spoiled with generosity. We were spoiled with meals and meals. We were spoiled as we were given an opportunity to be in a Broadway-level production. What a bonanza. If you offered me 10 business class seats to the French Riviera or join the Center production, I would choose the production without hesitation.

I never felt so taken care of. The investment that you made in us is just mind-blowing. The time, the effort, the energy is noticed and appreciated. We noticed the wonderful audience that applauded so loudly, that sat through the entirrreeeee production, that had their eyes glued to the stage, that gave us a standing ovation, and that waited to cheer us on at the end. WE NOTICED IT ALL AND WE THANK YOU!

I was so impressed that Joey Tawil and Rhonda were side-by-side at every rehearsal participating in this production, that Ricky Novick attended rehearsals, and that board members and community leaders frequented our practices. They checked in on their children, making sure we were doing well, moving along, and having fun.

I hope that every board member and community builder feels proud of the level of this event; the kaddoshness of bringing all types of members together. We used all our religious and cultural teachings. We were patient with each other, kind to each other, positive... We built each other up with compliments and encouragement. We were responsible to our teammates and appreciative of our sponsors. We worked hard with minimal chit chat, just commitment, responsibility, respect and fun.

Thank you from the bottom of my heart for spoiling us and investing in us, the community, people... all ages, all backgrounds, single, young, old... bringing us an experience that will last a lifetime. I hope you were proud because you all need to stand up and bow because you are EXCEPTIONAL in how you all built this community.

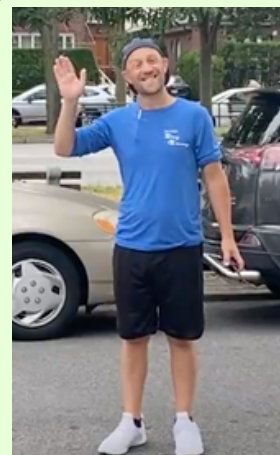
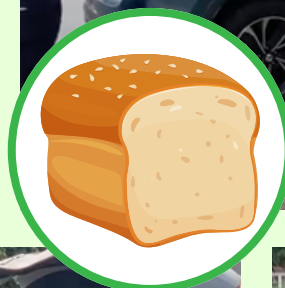

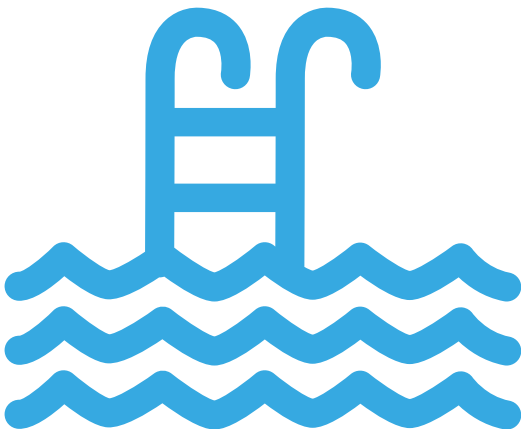
GROUP X

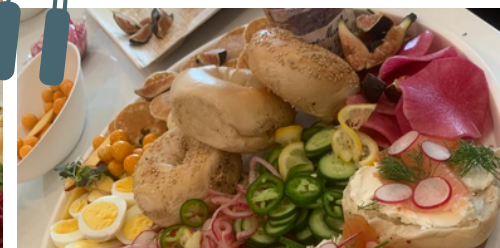

WOMEN'S CULTURE CLUB

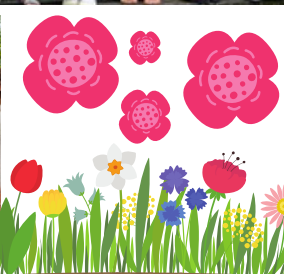

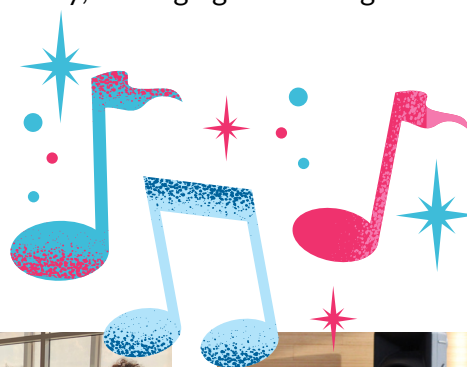
